Consideration and action concerning Resolution No. 05-26-2015A - a Resolution concerning Kendall County continuing to provide some services to the Comfort area in the event an election is held concerning the incorporation of the Comfort area and the voters approve incorporation
A petition seeking an election to incorporate the area of Comfort is being circulated. The petition must be submitted to the County Judge, and if it satisfies statutory requirements, the Judge must call an election on the issue of incorporation. Kendall County currently provides services to the area of Comfort within Kendall County, in particular, maintenance of county roads and bridges and law enforcement. If the area incorporates, the municipality will be responsible for provision of such services. Those citizens supporting incorporation are asking the Commissioners Court to continue provision of some services to the area in the event of incorporation to allow the resulting municipality time to get organized and financially able to provide all services currently provided by Kendall County.

KENDALL COUNTY RESOLUTION NO. 05-26-2015A RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE PROPOSED INCORPORATION OF COMFORT

WHEREAS, residents of the Comfort area have initiated an attempt to incorporate pursuant to Chapter 7, Texas Local Government Code; and

WHEREAS, the majority of the area of Comfort is located in the unincorporated area of Kendall County with a smaller area of Comfort located in the unincorporated area of Kerr County; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County is responsible for providing services to the area of Comfort located in Kendall County, and if the area does not incorporate, the County will continue to be responsible for providing such services; and

WHEREAS, as an incorporated municipality, Comfort would have the responsibility for provision of services to the area within the municipal limits, thereby relieving Kendall County of such responsibility; and

WHEREAS, if the decision is made by the voters to incorporate the area of Comfort, there is no additional financial burden for Kendall County to continue providing some services to the area within the corporate limits until such time as the resulting municipality is able to assume responsibility for providing services.

NOW, THEREFORE, the following **RESOLUTION** is adopted concerning the proposed incorporation of Comfort:

RESOLVED, that in the event the voters within the area proposed to be incorporated as the municipality of Comfort vote favorably for incorporation, Kendall County will, to the extent allowed by the Constitution and laws of the State of Texas, continue to provide all current services to Comfort for the next seven years, and during the eighth year the County will pass the expense of road, bridge and drainage maintenance to the municipality of Comfort, and during the ninth year the County will pass the expense of law enforcement to the municipality of Comfort. The details of the support provided to the municipality of Comfort by Kendall County will be set out in interlocal agreements to be negotiated between the two entities and submitted to the Commissioners Court for approval each year during the County budget process.

Main Street, Boerne, Kendall County, Texas for tax year 2015; such appraised value of improvements and enlargement to be the amount determined by the Kendall Appraisal District to be the increase of the appraised value of company property at the identified location resulting from construction of improvements and enlargement of facilities during tax year 2009 and not included in the appraised value of company property at the subject location for tax year 2009.

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PHYSIO-CONTROL, INC. TECHNICAL SERVICE SUPPORT AGREEMENT TERMS AND CONDITIONS

Customer's signature on this Agreement or a valid purchase order referencing this Technical Service Support Agreement is required prior to Physio-Control's acceptance and performance of this Agreement. This Agreement covers only the equipment listed on Schedule A ("Covered Equipment"). These terms constitute the complete agreement between the parties and they shall govern over any other documents, including Customer's purchase order. These terms may not be revised in any manner without the prior written consent of Physio-Control.

SERVICES. The Services provided under this Agreement are set forth on Schedule A. Physio-Control strives, but does not guarantee, to return service calls within two (2) hours and to resolve service issues within twenty-four (24) hours. Following Services, Physio-Control will provide Customer with a written report of actions taken or recommended and identification of any materials replaced or recommended for replacement. The following Services are available and further described as they relate to each specific Physio-Control device on Schedule B:

"Repair Plus Service" or "Repair Only Service" means repairs, Battery Replacement Service, parts and labor necessary to restore Covered Equipment to original specifications, subject to Exclusions (as set forth below).

"Preventative Maintenance" or "Inspection Only Service" means inspection and adjustment to maintain Covered Equipment in satisfactory operating condition. Inspections include tests, measurements, and a thirty-point evaluation of Covered Equipment. Covered Equipment is properly calibrated, mechanical operations are checked and adjusted, if necessary, and output measurements are verified to function properly. Electrical safety checks are also performed in accordance with National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) guidelines. Preventative Maintenance and Inspection Only Service are subject to Exclusions.

"Comprehensive Service" or "Repair & Inspect Service" means repairs, Battery Replacement Service, parts and labor necessary to restore Covered Equipment to original specifications, and inspections to verify proper device calibration, mechanical operations and output measurements, electrical safety check in accordance with NFPA guidelines, and Updates (as set forth below), subject to Exclusions.

"Battery Replacement Service" means replacement of batteries on a one-for-one, like-for-like basis, up to the number of batteries and/or devices listed in Schedule A. Only batteries manufactured or distributed by Physio-Control are eligible for replacement. Battery replacement is available upon Customer notification to Physio-Control of the occurrence of: (i) battery failure as determined by Customer's performance testing and evaluation in accordance with the applicable Operating Instructions; or (ii) as recommended in the applicable device's Operating Instructions.

At the discretion of Physio-Control, battery replacement shall be effected by shipment to Customer and replacement by Customer, or by on-site delivery and replacement by a Physio-Control Service Technician. 

Regional Disaster Finance Coordination Program

As emergency managers in the state of Texas, we tend to concentrate on mitigating, preparing and responding to emergencies from an operational perspective. Seldom do we do the same for the fiscal side of emergency management, with areas such as recovery often being an afterthought. With today's economy, fiscal responsibility needs to be considered at the beginning of the emergency, not at the end. Finance is part of all four areas of emergency management (mitigation, planning, response and recovery) and we should be concerned with much more than just how to respond to an emergency.

PURPOSE: On May 7, 2014, the Office of the Governor authorized a grant to help implement the Regional Disaster Finance Coordination Program. The Regional Disaster Finance Coordination Program is a new, innovative, proactive pilot program designed to give local jurisdictions the financial tools needed to help recover from a disaster before a disaster occurs, as well as facilitate collaboration and communication between disaster responders and financial managers prior to an emergency occurring. Embedded within the Field Response Section, this program is overseen by a state coordinator and will employ eight finance coordinators stationed throughout the state:

- One each for DPS Regions 1, 3, 4, 5, and 6
- Two for DPS Region 2
- One at headquarters to assist with state agencies

FOCUS: Program efforts will focus on accounting practices of individual finance departments, cataloguing current budget capabilities and ensuring compliance with federal rules to improve financial standard operating procedures and systems used during a disaster.

This focus is aligned with interim changes for the 83rd Legislature for the Texas House of Representatives Committee on Homeland Security and Public Safety and the Committee on County Affairs to assess and improve the level of preparedness and to coordinate with local emergency response to ensure economic stability.

NEXT STEPS: Over the next 12 months, the finance coordinators will conduct courses, workshops and meetings with executive staff and finance personnel throughout all 254 counties in Texas to promote financial responsibility and equip the jurisdictions with the tools necessary to track, calculate and justify the costs of an emergency.
