EXHIBIT A

JOINT ELECTION AGREEMENT

between **Kendall County** and the following Local Political Subdivision (LPS):

Comfort Independent School District

This Agreement is entered into by and between the Kendall County Elections Administrator "ADMINISTRATOR" and the entities of <u>Kendall County</u> and <u>Comfort Independent School District</u>. They may be referred to, individually, as an "Entity" or, collectively, as the "Entities," acting by and through their duly appointed and qualified representatives, pursuant to Texas Election Code Section 271.002(a).

It is agreed that the Entities will hold an election on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 8, 2016</u> (the "Joint Election") under the following terms and conditions:

I.

Each Entity shall share the expense of the Early Voting and Election Day polling locations consisting of on-site voting equipment, payroll of election workers, and other costs common to each Entities election, as applicable to the specific Entity and agreed upon by the election services contract. Each Entity understands they will appear on a joint ballot and use joint forms and election materials, which will better serve the voters.

II.

The Entities agree that the Kendall County Elections Administrator, Staci L. Decker, will serve as the Early Voting Clerk and the Central Count Station Manager for the **November 8, 2016** election.

III.

The Entities agree that a single ballot, containing all the measures and offices to be voted on at a particular polling place, shall be used in this Joint Election.

IV.

Each Entity is responsible for giving notice of their election pursuant to Section 4.003 of the Texas Election Code.

V.

ADMINISTRATOR will tabulate the ballots and provide each entity a Certification of Election Results along with the returns of the election.

VI.

Each Entity will be responsible for canvassing its respective precinct returns for the Joint Election.

If an Entity cancels its election pursuant to section 2.053 of the election code, that Entity shall promptly notify ADMINISTRATOR. Cancellation of an Entities election shall not void this agreement for any remaining Entity conducting an election on <u>Tuesday</u>, <u>November 8</u>, <u>2016</u>.

VIII.

The undersigned persons are the duly authorized signatories of their Entities, and their signatures represent acceptance of the terms and conditions of this Agreement, as passed and approved by their respective governing bodies.

IX.

This Agreement may be executed in two or more counterparts. Together the counterparts shall be deemed an executed original instrument. An original signed copy of this agreement shall be provided to each entity who enters into contract with ADMINISTRATOR.

STATE OF TEXAS KENDALL COUNTY

INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT FOR THE PAYMENT OF FUNDS FOR THE HIGHWAY 46 EAST FROM HERFF ROAD TO AMMANN ROAD IMPROVEMENT PROJECT

Kendall County ("County") and the City of Boerne ("City") (City and County collectively referred to as the "Parties") enter into this Interlocal Agreement ("Agreement") for the payment of funds to make certain highway improvements on Highway No. 46 from Herff Road to Ammann Road, and this section of highway improvements will necessitate the acquisition of certain right of way and the relocating and adjusting of utilities (the "Project"). The Parties are acting pursuant to the authority granted by the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 791, Texas Government Code.

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, Highway 46 from Herff Road to Ammann Road is located in the jurisdiction of City, which is wholly incorporated within the County, and the County; and

WHEREAS, City and County through their respective governing bodies have determined that Highway 46 is in need of improvements in order to adequately handle the increased traffic; and

WHEREAS, the governing bodies of the Parties have also determined that the Highway 46 improvements is a high priority item; and

WHEREAS, the Texas Department of Transportation ("TxDOT") has recommended the Highway 46 roadway improvements (the "Project") for submission; and

WHEREAS, in order for the TxDOT to submit the Project in a manner which would greatly improve the likelihood of funding by the MPO, TxDOT has recommended a local contribution of \$1,100,000, which is approximately eleven percent (11%) of the \$10,000,000.00 estimated Project cost; and

WHEREAS, the County and the City will share the local contribution equally at \$550,000 each (each Party's "Share"); and

WHEREAS, the County's Share will include a cost deduction for the County Right of Way contributions made to TxDOT in furtherance of the Project which cost the County \$119,838 an amount credited to the Project; and

WHEREAS, the Interlocal Cooperation Act gives counties and cities the authority to contract with other governmental entities concerning street, road and drainage projects.

NOW THEREFORE, in order to carry out the intent of the Parties in accordance with applicable law, the Parties agree as follows:

ARTICLE I PURPOSE

The purpose of this Agreement is to establish and clarify each Party's responsibilities, rights, and obligations, and the manner and method of payment of the local contribution amount

of ONE MILLION ONE HUNDRED THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$1,100,000) (hereinafter referred to as the "Total Contribution Amount").

ARTICLE II TERM

The initial term of this Agreement shall be from the date of execution of this Agreement until one year from such date, unless earlier terminated or extended by agreement of the Parties in accordance with applicable law. This Agreement will terminate automatically once the purposes of this Agreement have been fulfilled.

ARTICLE III DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE PARTIES

CITY and COUNTY agree that:

- 1. The Parties support the completion of the Project by TxDOT.
- 2. City commits to making a lump sum contribution of NINE HUNDRED EIGHTY THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED AND SIXTY TWO DOLLARS (\$980,162) to TxDOT for both the City and County Share for completion of the Project.
- The County agrees to deed over to TxDOT County Right of Way contributions for the Project which TxDOT will credit ONE HUNDRED NINETEEN THOUSAND EIGHT HUNDRED AND THIRTY EIGHT DOLLARS (\$119,838) towards the Total Contribution Amount.
- 4. County commits to participating in the Project by making a lump sum contribution of FOUR HUNDRED THIRTY THOUSAND ONE HUNDRED SIXTY TWO DOLLARS (\$430,162) to the City for the remainder of the County's Share towards the completion of the Project not later than the day the City is required to pay the Total Contribution Amount for the Project to TxDOT.
- 5. The Parties agree that should any third party contribute monies to the Total Contribution Amount required for the Project, the Parties will use the amount received to decrease the Parties' share of the Total Contribution Amount due and owing.

ARTICLE IV TEXAS LAW TO APPLY

This Agreement shall be construed under and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. All obligations of both Parties are performable in Kendall County, Texas.

ARTICLE V SEVERABILTY

In case any one or more of the provisions contained in this Agreement shall for any reason be held to be invalid, illegal or unenforceable in any respect, such invalidity, illegality or unenforceability shall not affect any other provisions thereof and this Agreement shall be construed as if such invalid, illegal, or unenforceable provision had never been contained herein.

ARTICLE VI AMENDMENTS

No amendment, modification or alteration of the terms of this Agreement shall be binding unless in writing, dated subsequent to the date of this Agreement and duly authorized by the governing bodies of the Parties.

ARTICLE VII LIAISONS AND NOTICES

Unless written notification by County to the contrary is received by City, the County Judge or designee shall be the designated representative of County responsible for the management of this Agreement.

Unless written notification by City to the contrary is received by County, the City Manager or designee shall be the designated representative of City responsible for management of this Agreement.

Communications between City and County shall be directed to the designated representative of each Party as set forth above.

For purposes of this Agreement, all official communications and notices between the Parties shall be deemed sufficient if in writing and hand delivered or mailed, registered or certified mail, postage prepaid, to the addresses set forth below:

WHEREAS, the Cow Creek Groundwater Conservation District (hereinafter "CCGCD") is a political subdivision and/or agency of the State of Texas; and

WHEREAS, the CCGCD performs a public function, to wit, conserving, preserving, recharging, protecting, and preventing waste of groundwater from aquifers within Kendall County, including the regulation of water well drilling and production; and

WHEREAS, the CCGCD is in need of office space; and

WHEREAS, Kendall County has available suitable office space in the Kendall County Courthouse owned by Kendall County and subject to the control of the Commissioners Court of Kendall County; and

WHEREAS, the Commissioners Court finds and determines that it will promote a public purpose of Kendall County to lease property belonging to Kendall County to CCGCD and provide office space to CCGCD subject to the terms of the following agreement so as to promote and maintain a public purpose;

NOW THEREFORE, Kendall County and the CCGCD enter into the following agreement to promote and maintain a public purpose:

PARTIES: The parties to this agreement are the owner of the Property, Kendall County, Texas (hereinafter "COUNTY") and the lessee of the Property, CCGCD.

PURPOSE OF AGREEMENT: Pursuant to the provisions of Section 272.005, Texas Local Government Code, COUNTY leases to CCGCD, office space in the Kendall County Courthouse subject to the terms and conditions stated in this agreement.

PROPERTY: COUNTY rents to CCGCD that real property located at 201 East San Antonio Avenue, Boerne, Kendall County, Texas further identified as Suite 100, Kendall County Courthouse.

TERM: This agreement commences on October 1, 2016 and ends on September 30, 2017, unless renewed, extended or terminated earlier in accordance with the terms set out herein.

TERMINATION: Either party may terminate this agreement. The party desiring to terminate the agreement shall give the other party ninety (90) sixty (60) days written notice of its intent to terminate the agreement. The agreement shall terminate upon the expiration of ninety (90) sixty (60) days following notice with no further obligation on either party provided that all amounts owed to COUNTY by CCGCD shall be paid in full.

RENT: Rental shall be at the rate of One thousand, three hundred and no/100 dollars (\$1,300.00) per month. Rent payments are due in advance and shall be paid by CCGCD to COUNTY on or before the first day of each month with the first payment being due on or before October 1, 2016 and subsequent payments being due on or before the first day of each succeeding month. Payments shall be made by checks payable to "Kendall County, Texas" and mailed or delivered to the County Treasurer, Suite 302, Kendall County Courthouse, 201 East San Antonio Avenue, Boerne, Texas 78006

UTILITIES - RESPONSIBILITY FOR PAYMENT:

- 1. COUNTY shall pay fees and charges for the following utilities: Electricity, water, trash pick up and sewage disposal.
- 2. CCGCD shall pay fees and charges for telephone and computer services, including any connection fee, monthly service charges, and any other charges and/or costs related to the provision of telephone, computer, Internet, television services, and any other services desired by CCGCD and not provided by COUNTY.

USE AND OCCUPANCY:

- 1. ALLOWABLE USES: CCGCD shall use the premises for the following purposes: Office spaces for CCGCD. (Note: It is understood by the parties that CCGCD will hold meetings of its Board of Directors, hearings and other CCGCD functions in the Commissioners Court meeting room, Suite 300, Kendall County Courthouse. Scheduling of meetings by CCGCD shall be made with the County Judge's office. In the event of a conflict for use of the Commissioners Court meeting room due to the use of that room by COUNTY or by another party authorized to use the room by COUNTY, COUNTY will provide CCGCD with another suitable meeting room either in the Courthouse or in the Historic Courthouse.
- 2. PROHIBITIONS: CCGCD may not use the premises or permit the premises to be used for any activity that is unlawful, offensive, dangerous or that constitutes a nuisance.

ACCESS BY COUNTY: Officers, agents or employees of COUNTY may enter the premises to clean the premises and for other lawful purposes, provided that such entry is done at a time and in a manner acceptable to CCGCD, and provided further that such entry shall not interfere with use of the premises by CCGCD. In addition, at its option, CCGCD may prevent or restrict access to one or more rooms or offices in the premises as necessary to protect privileged or confidential information.

MAINTENANCE AND UPKEEP OF THE PREMISES:

- 1. CCGDC'S RESPONSIBILITIES: CCGCD shall ensure that the premises are maintained in the same condition as such existed at the beginning of the tenancy period. CCGCD shall promptly notify COUNTY of any needed repairs or maintenance.
- COUNTY'S RESPONSIBILITIES: COUNTY shall be responsible for cleaning and maintaining the premises and for making any repairs to the premises, provided that COUNTY, in its sole discretion, shall decide what repairs are required and the time and manner of making such repairs.

DEFAULT:

- 1. Default by COUNTY: If COUNTY breaches this agreement; CCGCD shall be entitled to terminate this agreement.
- Default by CCGCD: If CCGCD breaches this agreement, COUNTY shall be entitled to terminate this agreement and recover any damages to premises caused by the fault or negligence of CCGCD.
- 3. Attorney's fees and costs: The prevailing party in any litigation brought by either party against the other party to enforce any provision of this agreement, or to seek any remedy or relief pursuant to this agreement, shall be entitled to collect reasonable and necessary attorney's fees and costs of court from the losing party.

ASSIGNMENT AND SUBLETTING: CCGCD shall not assign or sublet the premises or any part thereof.

INSURANCE: COUNTY shall be responsible for insuring the premises against fire and any other casualty loss in an amount determined by COUNTY. CCGCD shall be responsible for insuring any property, including personal property, of CCGCD located on the premises.

INDEMNIFICATION: CCGCD does hereby agree to indemnify and hold harmless COUNTY, its officers, agents and employees, against any and all claims, demands or causes of action that may be made against COUNTY, its officers, agents or employees, by reason of, or in any way arising from this agreement or the performance of the terms of this agreement or CCGCD's use and/or occupancy of the premises or arising from third parties use or presence on the premises during the term of this agreement, it being CCGCD's intention to fully indemnify COUNTY, its officers, agents and employees from any liability arising from this agreement.

EXTENSION, RENEWAL: The parties may extend this agreement for any term of less that twelve (12) months by an agreement in writing approved by the governing body of each party and signed by the authorized representative of each party. Unless either party notifies the other party in writing at least ninety (90) sixty (60) days prior to the end of the term of its desire to terminate or modify the terms of this agreement, this agreement will be automatically renewed for a period of twelve (12) months.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS:

- 1. LAW: The provisions of this agreement shall be interpreted in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas. Venue for any suit arising from this agreement shall be in Kendall County, Texas.
- 2. ENTIRE AGREEMENT: This document contains the entire agreement between the parties concerning the rental of the premises by CCGCD. No amendment to this agreement shall be valid unless it is in writing, signed by both parties or their authorized agent and dated subsequent to the date of this agreement.
- 3. BINDING EFFECT: This agreement is binding upon and inures to the benefit of the parties to this agreement and to their respective and permitted successors and assigns.
- 4. NOTICES: All notices under this agreement shall be delivered to the respective party at the addresses indicated herein or such other addresses that the parties may designate in writing.

A minimum of 3 compaction tests will be billed each time this service is requested and the compaction test fee includes the technician time, equipment, and reporting. The fee for a set of concrete test cylinders and mortar cubes includes the technician time up to 1-hour onsite, sampling equipment, casting, curing, testing the specimens, and reporting the test results. Work before 8 am and after 5 pm, standby time, and weekend time will be billed at a rate of \$45.00 an hour in addition to the testing fee. Professional Engineer and Certified Weld Inspector for requested special inspections will be billed at a minimum rate of 2-hours and 4-hours, respectively. The transportation charge includes the travel time and all vehicle charges. Report review charges are included in the unit rates.

Estimated Budget

Based on the project information provided to RETL, the project will include construction of approximately 12,500 SF of additions and renovations to the existing EMS Center. The building additions will have slab-on-grade foundation systems and will be pre-engineered metal buildings with masonry façade. The building pad construction for the additions will consist of approximately 5-feet of cut and 6-feet of compacted select fill. In addition, concrete and asphalt paving will be constructed.
